**First Reading**—Job spoke, saying: I have been assigned months of misery, and troubled nights have been allotted to me (Job 7:1-4,6-7).

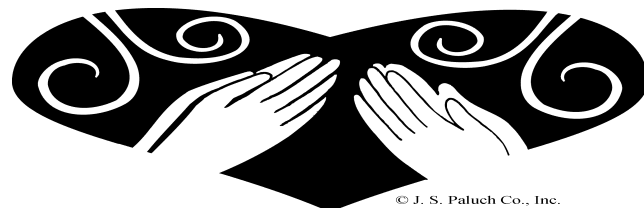

## The Rosary



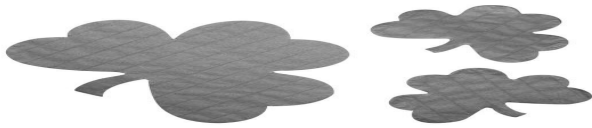
A group of our parishioners meet every Saturday at 4:30 to pray the ROSARY.

### DIGNITY AND UNIFORMITY OF SACRED LITURGY

#### SAY IT LIKE YOU MEAN IT!

When we are given the Eucharist as the body of Christ, we confirm that we believe it to be true. It is a statement of our faith in Christ and what the Catholic Church teaches. When the priest or extraordinary minister presents us with the Eucharist, our “Amen!” is a public declaration that we believe this bread and wine are truly the body and blood of the Lord, not just symbols of his presence.

Any time we say amen at the end of prayers or when receiving the sacraments, *we proclaim the truth of it*, that we believe what is said or done. Because of this, it is important to respond with some **enthusiasm**.

Awareness can help us be more conscious of what we're saying and prevent us from falling into the trap of going through the motions of the liturgy and the Mass.

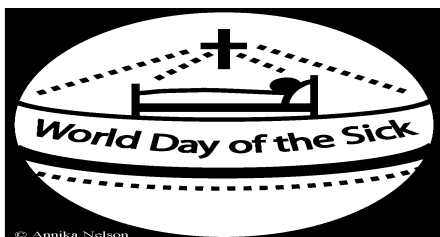

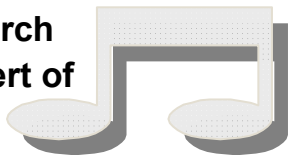
