### DIGNITY AND UNIFORMITY OF SACRED LITURGY

***“We should come to the sacred liturgy appropriately dressed. As Christians we should dress in a modest manner, wearing clothes that reflect our reverence for God and that manifest our respect for the dignity of the liturgy and for one another.” USCB***

Today's casual cultural practices do not demand formality in dress. Even so, is there not more than a little vanity and presumption in expecting God to “take us as we are?”

Clothes say something about what we think, what we value. They also influence how we behave and feel. That our culture has become so casual about everything says something about us - *“nothing is really all that important.”* Not true. Going to God's house **IS** important. Being ministered to by the King of Kings and Lord of Lords is astounding. Sunday is special, God's House is special.

If one were invited to dinner at the president's house, or the CEO of one's company, he/she would wear the finest and the best he had, and his clothes would be decent. We sometimes tend to lose that perspective for some reason when we come into the house of God. There is a certain civility that's expected when in the church and respect and modesty is expected.

It does matter to our neighbor what we wear. If what we're wearing in church or what we're doing while we should be paying attention to God's Word is a distraction and hindrance to others, then we need to rethink what we're doing.

**Mass is a stupendous miracle and those who partake of the heavenly banquet are tremendously privileged. We need to acknowledge this privilege.**



## THE DIOCESE OF CHARLESTON

January 30, 2012

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

I write to you concerning an alarming and serious matter that negatively impacts the Church in the United States directly, and that strikes at the fundamental right to religious liberty for all citizens of any faith. The federal government, which claims to be “of, by, and for the people,” has just dealt a heavy blow to almost a quarter of those people—the Catholic population—and to the millions more who are served by the Catholic faithful.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services announced last week that almost all employers, *including Catholic employers*, will be *forced* to offer their employees’ health coverage that includes sterilization, abortion-inducing drugs, and contraception. Almost all health insurers will be *forced* to include those “services” in the health policies they write. And almost all individuals will be *forced* to buy that coverage as a part of their policies.

In so ruling, the Administration has cast aside the First Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, denying to Catholics our Nation’s first and most fundamental freedom, that of religious liberty. And as a result, unless the rule is overturned, we Catholics will be compelled either to violate our consciences, or to drop health coverage for our employees (and suffer the penalties for doing so). The Administration’s sole concession was to give our institutions one year to comply.

I stand in unity with Catholic bishops throughout the United States and other religious leaders vowing to fight this mandate. I insist that this is a direct attack on our religious freedom and our First Amendment rights. I will work with the bishops, other religious leaders and our fellow Americans to remove this unjust regulation.

If the administration will not rescind this violation of our First Amendment rights, we must call on our elected leaders to do so. And therefore, I would ask of you two things. **First**, as a community of faith we must commit ourselves to prayer and fasting that wisdom and justice may prevail, and religious liberty may be restored. Without God, we can do nothing; with God, nothing is impossible. **Second**, I would also recommend visiting [www.usccb.org/conscience](http://www.usccb.org/conscience), to learn more about this severe assault on religious liberty, and how to contact our elected representatives to seek a just resolution of this issue.
