SACRAMENTS

Baptism: The celebration of Baptism is a moment of Grace for those to be baptized, for their families, and for the entire Parish Community. Preparation class is held the last Tuesday of each month at 7pm. Please call the office to RSVP. A Parish is a certain community of the Christian faithful stably constituted in a particular church, whose pastoral care is entrusted to a pastor (*Code of Canon Law #515*). Therefore, it is important for parishioners to register for contact and pastoral reasons. You must have a sponsor letter from the parish in which each of the godparents reside. A godparent must have received the sacraments of Baptism, Penance, Holy Communion and, if married, have been married in the Catholic Church.

Marriage: Couples planning to be married must see a priest at least six months prior to the planned marriage. Couples seeking to be married at All Saints need to fulfill the All Saints pre-marriage process. The Wedding Coordinator and/or the Pastor will provide the couple with the guidelines and secure the date and time of the wedding. Do not set a date in advance until you have spoken to the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if you or a member of your family need the Sacrament of Anointing.

After Hours Sick Calls: In case of serious illness after hours, please call 803-627-5297 and leave a message. Messages are checked regularly.

Does Your Pancreas Run On AAA Batteries?

Type 1 diabetes is an autoimmune disease in which a person's pancreas stops producing insulin, a hormone people need to get energy from food, without insulin you would die. If you had T1D you would have to regularly monitor

your blood-sugar levels, this may involve pricking your fingers up to ten times a day. With T1D every time you want something to eat you must prick your finger, count the number of carbohydrates you will consume, take into consideration what your blood-sugar number is and then give yourself an injection of insulin. If you have a pump, which is attached to you 24 hours a day 7 days a week, then you are getting small amounts of insulin throughout the day but you must program the pump to deliver more insulin when you eat or if your blood-sugars are high. And if your pump alarms make sure to check it.....because it could be that the AAA batteries are low. Did you know that three of your fellow parishioners have T1D and wear insulin pumps to stay alive? These families will once again participate in the JDRF One Walk on April 22 at Carowinds, raising money to help fund a cure for T1D. You may visit walk.jdrf.org. Our family team is **Jake's J Walkers**, any donation is greatly appreciated. Our heartfelt thanks to the many parishioners who continue to support us through the years.
