

All parishioners, especially those who have lost someone this year, are invited to bring a picture of their deceased loved ones for this beautiful Mass.





"My Flesh Is Real Food" November 4th through November 9th



Father Jim Costigan, CPM, born in 1951, was raised and educated in Los Angeles, California He has an M.A. in English from Cal Poly, Pomona and a Master of Divinity from Holy Apostles College and Seminary, Cromwell, Connecticut. A

carpenter and a teacher, Father Jim also has many years experience as a prayer warrior and counselor outside of America's abortion clinics. He made his first religious vows in 1997 and was ordained to the priesthood for the Fathers of Mercy in 2002. Having served one year as associate pastor of Sacred Heart Church in Russellville, Kentucky, he now travels America giving parish missions and retreats, especially missions aimed at the establishment and promotion of Eucharistic Adoration in chapels and churches.

Father Jim will conduct our Parish Mission, **"My Flesh is Real Food",** scheduled for November 4th through November 9th. He will hear confessions on Saturday and celebrate the weekend Masses. The Rock Hill Deanery of the South Carolina Council of Catholic Women joins with the Diocese of Charleston to bring awareness to Domestic Violence in our state. Please read these statistics and join us in prayer. Through awareness and education South Carolina has moved from the highest rate in the country to number 5. This is still a horrific number but we are making a difference. **Domestic Violence Awareness Month** 1. Twenty people are physically abused by intimate partners every minute. This equates to more than 10 million abuse victims. 2. One in three women and one in four men have been physically abused by an intimate partner. 3. One in five women and one in seven men have been severely physically abused by an intimate partner. 4. On a typical day, domestic violence hotlines nationwide receive approximately 20,800 calls. 5. The presence of a gun in a domestic violence situation increases the risk of homicide by 500%. 6. Domestic violence accounts for 15% of all violent crime. Weapons are involved in 19% of all instances of domestic violence. 7. Only 34% of people who are injured by intimate partners receive medical care for their injuries because they are too afraid to report it. 8. Victims of domestic violence lose a total of 8 million days of paid work each year. 9. Twenty-five percent of women killed in the workplace is a result of domestic violence. 10. The cost of domestic violence exceeds \$8.3 billion annually. SACRAMENTS

Baptism: The celebration of Baptism is a moment of Grace for those to be baptized, for their families, and for the entire Parish Community. Preparation class is held the last Tuesday of each month at 7pm. Please call the office to RSVP. A Parish is a certain community of the Christian faithful stably constituted in a particular church, whose pastoral care is entrusted to a pastor (*Code of Canon Law* #515). Therefore, it is important for parishioners to register for contact and pastoral reasons. You must have a sponsor letter from the parish in which each of the godparents reside. A godparent must have received the sacraments of Baptism, Penance, Holy Communion and, if married, have been married in the Catholic Church.

Marriage: Couples planning to be married must see a priest at least six months prior to the planned marriage. Couples seeking to be married at All Saints need to fulfill the All Saints pre-marriage process. The Wedding Coordinator and/or the Pastor will provide the couple with the guidelines and secure the date and time of the wedding. Do not set a date in advance until you have spoken to the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if you or a member of your family need the Sacrament of Anointing.

After Hours Sick Calls: In case of serious illness after hours, please call 803-627-5297 and leave a message. Messages are checked regularly.
